Our AIMS for MORAL development: Children...


- o recognise the difference between right and wrong.

- Harvester Meal Voucher rewards for KS2
- Trips and visitors from different faiths
- Debates in History lessons on the actions of key people
- Life Education Bus visits focused on healthy living

- Competitions such as the Poetry Competition rewards prizes recognising hard work
