Continue with our progress from last year and provide daily opportunities for running and power walking to boost children’s fitness levels. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provide opportunities for daily running at break and lunchtimes through the sports leader zones. Continue to use the ‘Marathon Kids’ app to track and monitor the children’s progress. Employ a sports coach to oversee the running of the sports zones with the sports leaders – ensuring that they are all set up and managed correctly. 	<p>46%</p> <p>£3800</p> <p>£1000</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Early in the year, we found that our sports leaders understandably needed more assistance with the running of events (as this was the first time we reintroduced the zones since the lockdowns). We therefore invested in a teaching assistant, who demonstrated a passion for sports, to help alongside the sports leaders and sports coach. The impact of this is that sports leaders received more guidance and support so they were more confident in leading the different areas that we have. All children from Years 5 and 6 were able to participate in swimming lessons to catch up with the swimming lessons that they would have received in Year 4. <p><u>Sustainability and suggested next steps:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The sports coach and teaching assistant can continue to work with the new Year 5 children (as well as the current Year 5 children) so that we have a wealth of Year 5 and 6 Sports leaders who feel confident in running and leading events. Next year, we will continue to give two years swimming lessons in Year 5 and Year 4 so that in the Year 2023-2024, we will be back in line with the way our swimming lessons used to run in just having them in one year group.

However, with our 'Spectacular Summer of Sports' all children from Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1 and 2 were able to enjoy the workshops, sessions and experiences. We have also had in a Freestyle Footballer who has shown all of our children that football isn't just a game, but there are lots of other exciting physical activities that we can do within that sport such as learning and developing new skills/tricks.
			<p><u>Sustainability and suggested next steps</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> AD has completed training with Enrich so that the orienteering scheme and markers, that have been put in recently, can be utilised and used effectively with other teachers and year groups. AD will need to lead a staff meeting to share his knowledge of this with other teachers. AD and JW have participated in a tri-golf CPD. Next year, we are therefore planning to teach this to children, and if successful with these year groups, we will roll this out to others.
