- Know how to develop ideas for 3D work through drawing and visualisation in
 2D
- Know how to use more complex techniques to shape materials
- Know how shapes can be formed and joined in wire
- Know how to consider the effect of how sculpture is displayed.

In the immersive room, take a trip to Brazil and see key human/physical features, then jet off to Scotland and then Fiji so children can see how to go between.




