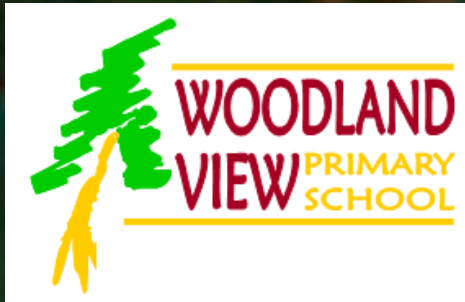


Sports Premium Funding 2019-2020 Intended Use

Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • More children from Years 5 and 6 became a Sports leader than the previous year • Over 69% of Key Stage 2 children attend at least one club. • Over 65% of Key Stage 2 children attend more than one club. • More activities have been introduced in the playground to engage the least active children. E.g. Funky Friday zone. • Our annual cluster Olympics event has continued meaning that 100% of Year 6 have competed in a Level 2 event. • Over 63% of Key Stage 2 children participated in a Level 2 event this year. • Outdoor Gym provides daily physical activity opportunities for all pupils • 15 of our competitive teams were winners or runners up in local, district or county events 	<p>Outdoor Gym equipment (that we purchased last year) was a huge hit with children. Over 95% of Key Stage 2 children went on this on a weekly basis. However, a new adventure trail is needed to provide greater variety of upper and lower body activities. This will be part funded by some of last year's Sports Premium, and part from this year.</p> <p>This year, we would like to continue to target our least active children, encouraging them to do at least 30 minutes of physical activity per day. Our high percentage of Level 2 participation levels show that we are effectively encouraging children to take part. We are now looking towards the other 37% that didn't compete at Level 2 and exploring ways in which we can get them to be more active</p> <p>The new adventure trail, is aimed at encouraging all children (including our least active children) to be physically active daily. We will also be looking into trialing videos that encourage children to be active. E.g. videos from GoNoodle. By offering these opportunities, we will hopefully also see an increase in the amount of children participating in clubs.</p>
